Subject: Snow Clearing

The recent snow falls in Lake Cowichan have made it difficult to keep the sidewalks and parking areas clear at our Olson Manor facility. While our staff have worked hard to follow the rules of keeping the sidewalks clear fronting our property, the works crew have added to the problem with their methods of road clearing.

While we accept the fact that road clearing is a priority it would seem that a little extra time could be taken to move snow to another location and NOT cover the already cleared sidewalk and parking areas. This then requires our staff to return and again clear the sidewalks and once again dig out the parked cars. We are sure you can appreciate that most, if not all of the residents of Olson Manor are not physically able to do snow clearing which means it falls entirely on our staff. This situation seems to repeat itself numerous times on the same day. Since there is no on street parking permitted on the King George side of the building the snow clearing efforts of the town simply rebury the sidewalk and parking area every time Town snow clearing equipment does it's job.

We respectfully request that consideration be given to the access to our facility when snow clearing is required. If possible could we or I have a meeting with the Works Superintendent in the near future?
