7. REPORT

(a) The consulting planner raised aspects of the housing strategy session that he had attended which could be applied to meet housing needs in Lake Cowichan. One issue is the use of Temporary Use Permits to expand the housing supply. Another is to participate in a programme that is meant for larger municipalities whereby short-term rentals can be regulated by the Province by limiting their use to the Province's principal use requirement.

that it be recommended that the council make application to the Province to limit short-term rentals just to where the principal residence requirement is satisfied.

(b) The consulting planner provided a copy of the last regional climate adaptation advisory group for the Commission's benefit. A number of climate issues were raised which included the Town's plan to

update the Official Community Plan with climate adaptation goals in mind.

- (c) The consulting planner spoke on the successful CMHC grant application and the terms that have to met to secure the full approved funding.
- (d) The consulting planner spoke on the implementation of proactive tools the Province is introducing to support increased housing supply and growth.
- (e) The introduction of small scale, multi-unit housing legislation is seen as a means to make housing more affordable.
- (f) The new secondary suite incentive program being introduced by the Province to be effective April 17th 2024 was treated as information.
- (g) The consulting planner reported on the Cowichan Regional Airshed roundtable he had attended earlier in the day. The focus is still on the wood stove exchange program.
