## **NOTICE TO RESIDENTS**

## **OPEN BURNING and CAMPFIRES**

The Town of Lake Cowichan is advising residents that they are permitted under its current regulations to have cooking fires or campfires so long as they are contained within a fire pit or within a manufactured gas or electric barbeque. All other outdoor fires are prohibited.

Violators face fines of \$1,150 per incident and if a violation causes a wildfire, the person responsible may also be ordered to pay all firefighting and associated costs.
